Our Art & Imagination camps are designed to provide a warm, welcoming environment geared specifically toward the creative spirit of the young child. Each weekly camp is a creative mix of arts and crafts projects, free art play, story time, outdoor playtime and collaborative art. Our week-long morning camp sessions begin June 4th. We also offer a two (M&F) or three days option (T,W,Th). Campers should dress for a mess and bring a snack each day. We only accept 8 children for each session, so please be sure to register early!

Dr. Dolittle's Darlin's The vet is in! This camp is for kids who dream of being a vet some-day or for any child who loves to play doctor. We will set up our very own animal hospital, with our dolls and animals from home as our patients. We will make our own pet carriers, ID badges, Dr. coats, eye charts, ear scopes, plaster casts, medical charts and more. Each child will compile their own medical kit from our weeks activities for them to continue doctoring at home.

Faeries Realm Children will delight in this visit to the magical world of fairies and gnomes. In this camp we will create sea, woodland and flower faeries, along with their faerie habitats, using glitter, sparkling jewels and materials from nature.

Faces, Friends & Family Children will have fun with paint, clay and found objects as we read and share stories about families and friends—even our furry ones. Our creations will go home in unique memory chests that we have decorated over the course of the camp week. Please bring photographs of friends and family as well as family stories.



Prehistoric Pipsqueaks Learn about prehistoric creatures real and mythical in this fun and educational camp. Children will make dragon puppets, cast dino footprints and have fun imagining what life was like when dinosaurs ruled the Earth!

Silly Safari Venture into the jungles of South America and plains of Africa to learn about the amazing creatures that call it home. We will roar like lions, stomp like elephants and squawk like parrots while we bring our masks and sculptures to come alive! We will also discuss endangered animals and paint posters of them.

Snugglebunnies The perfect class for any child that loves stuffed animals or dolls! We will learn to sew (in an age appropriate manner) while making soft, cuddly beanbag friends, furry animals, rag dolls and other snuggly creatures.

Wiggle Worms in this camp we will explore plantlife and creatures that live in a garden through a variety of arts and crafts projects. While creating art we will learn about nature's mysteries such as the migration of birds and the metamorphosis of a caterpillar into a butterfly. We will also create some mythical garden dwellers such as fairies and gnomes.

Kid's Art Camp (grades 1–5), (grades 3–6)

The Katonah Art Center Kids' Art Camp is a great alternative to full-day summer-long programs. Our small camp groups enable students to receive individual attention in a warm, family-like atmosphere. All of our camps are one-week sessions with half-day, full-day and extended-day options. Groups are limited to 5–15 campers, depending on the topic. Ages for camps are grades 1-5, unless otherwise noted in the description as grades 3-6. Campers should dress for a mess and bring a snack each day. Full-day campers should also bring a lunch and will be escorted to lunchtime and to their next afternoon topic. Campers grades 6 & up may also register in the teen section. Please note: subjects listed are options – choose one subject for each half-day weekly session.

Acting & Theatre Arts

This camp is perfect for children interested in acting and theatre design. Students will create one scene, designing a stage set, creating costumes and learning basic make-up techniques. We will also collaborate a skill that be will performed in our set on the last day of camp.

Candlemaking Come learn the ancient art of candle making. Students will create beeswax, pillars, votive and dipped candles. We will also make a gel candle aquarium. This is one of our most popular camps, for both staff and students!

Cartooning If you enjoy watching cartoons and comic books, you'll love creating your own! Come learn about single and multiple frame cartoons and let your imagination run wild!

Customize-It (Gr.3–6) This camp is perfect for the child who likes to stand out from the crowd! In this camp we will bring our "stuff" from home and turn them into works of art. Shirts, sneakers, jeans, skateboards, computer cases, phone cases, even bicycles; if it can brought to the art center it can be customized! We will be tie-dyeing, painting, stamping, creating iron-on transfers, air-brushing and more in this incomparably creative camp.

Famous Artists This class offers young artists the opportunity to explore the history of art through hands-on experience. Using a variety of materials, students will learn about the styles and techniques of famous artists and art movements, while creating their own works.

Flash Animation

(Grades 3–6) Create your own cartoon! In this camp students will learn how to use digital drawing tablets to create their own characters and settings. Campers will then make a short animated film, bringing their characters to life with Adobe Flash animation. Please bring a flash drive so your work can be brought home at the end of the week.

Fun with Photoshop

(Grades 3–6) Create art using Apple© computers, digital cameras, and Adobe Photoshop©. We will our imaginations take us into the ideas of morphing our photos into unique works of computer art and much more. Children will learn to layer pictures, use filters, and manipulate color, size and backgrounds.

Jewelrymaking Learn the basics of beading, wire art and polymer clay bead-making while creating beautiful jewelry for yourself, family and friends. We will make earrings, bracelets, necklaces, hair-clips and more.

Make a Movie (Grades 4–8)

In this camp each child will write an improvised script for their own mini-movie as well as assist and perform in the movies of their classmates. Each student will learn to edit their own movies and to add special effects. On Fridays, there will be an award ceremony and screening of all the student's movies from 6-7pm.

Mechanical Sculpture

In this class students will use pieces of old toys, found objects and discarded machine parts along with batteries, to create moving works of art. Students may bring in any discarded toys, and/or machines parts for this class.

Mosaics In this camp students will learn the basics of mosaics from design to the finished piece votives, coasters, stepping stones and more.

Nature & Art In this class students will focus on learning to really “see” and draw from nature. Each students will have a sketchbook and sketching set of materials. We will take nature walks collecting specimens or drawing on site. We will also use a variety of drawing, painting and sculpting medium.

Paint, Draw & Sculpt In this class we will focus on the visual arts of drawing, painting and sculpture. We will experiment with charcoal, acrylics, watercolor and clay as we explore landscape, still life, portrait and the figure. We will have a clothed model present for the last two days of class.

Paper Arts In this camp we will focus on creating things out of paper and paper pulp. We will learn origami, and how to create paper bowls and paintings from pulp. We will use our homemade paper for cards and paper sculptures. This camp is somewhat messy but loads of fun!

Pottery Come and learn the ancient art of pottery! Learn to hand-build or throw pots on the wheel (ages 8+ for wheel) and create other various projects out of clay. Let your imagination run wild. Students should check the website schedule to see when work is ready to be picked up. Please bring a towel.

Sewing (Grades 4–6)

Children will learn basic construction and sewing techniques. Using these skills we will make projects such as tote bags, stuffed animals or simple wearable items. This camp will provide lots of fun for every student, giving them increased knowledge of how pieces are made and a great sense of pride in their finished work. Students should bring a sewing machine, if possible.

Stop-Motion Animation (Grades 3–6)

Bring collage to life with stop motion animation. In this camp we will create characters and environments from magazines, book illustrations, patterned paper and paint. We will illustrate our stories and narratives with stop motion animation. This class will be split between the art studio and the computer lab.

Teen Camps for Grades 6+

The Katonah Art Center Teen Camp is a great option for teens that love art and might be too old for, or bored by traditional day camps. Each one-week session will focus intensively on a single topic. Our goal is to instill in each camper the skills needed to continue to explore the subject independently. Teen Camp groups are limited to 5 - 12 campers, depending on the topic. Campers should dress appropriately for art and bring a snack each day. Full-day campers should also bring a lunch. Please note: Subjects listed are options – choose one subject for each half-day weekly session. Materials are included for all camps except where noted in class descriptions.

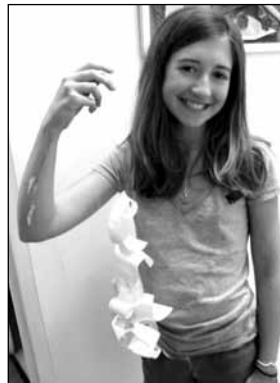

Art Journals This camp is the ultimate in creative expression! We will build our own books creating beautiful Art Journals. Using collages, drawings, pen and ink, and paint students will learn to express themselves through art and writing. This is a valuable skill for teenagers and one that can become a lifelong creative outlet.

Black & White Photography

In this camp students will be introduced to basic black & white photographic procedures. Students will learn how to meter for proper exposure, process their own film, and print their own images in our darkroom. Experienced darkroom students are welcome. Students must provide their own supplies, please call for a list.

Digital Photography & Stop-Motion Animation

Students will learn how to compose interesting shots, how to use light, and edit their photos using Photoshop©. They will also gain an understanding of the functions and features of their digital cameras. We will also have the opportunity to create stop-motion animations. Note: Students must bring a digital camera with charged batteries, a USB, power cord and flash drive to transfer work.

Drawing This camp is for students who love art and are interested in furthering their abilities. We will explore the technical process and varied styles of drawing. We will focus on the use and manipulation of dry media including: colored pencil, charcoal, graphite and and conte pencils.

Students will be taught basics of perspective, scale, negative space, use of line and value. Students must provide their own materials, please call for a list.

Fashion Illustration

This camp, intended for students who want to design apparel and illustrate designs, develops the skills and fundamental techniques necessary to draw a fashion figure. We will cover proportion and scale as it relates to the human body, how to draw figures in motion, clothing details such as ruffles, gathers and tucks and more. Students must provide their own supplies, please call for a list.

Flash Animation Create your own cartoon! In this camp students will learn how to use digital drawing tablets to create their own characters and settings. Campers will then make a short animated film, bringing their characters to life with Adobe Flash© animation. Please bring a flash drive so your work can be brought home at the end of the week.

Jewelry & Clay Silver

Students will learn the basis of beading while creating earrings, necklaces, bracelets and more. Students will also spend one day working with Clay Silver, a media shaped by hand and kiln fired. The end product is 99.9% pure silver. Students receive their own tool kit that is theirs to keep at the end of the week. Note: There is a silver material fee of \$50 for this class.

Manga Learn the distinctive style of Japanese cartooning called Manga used in Anime films. In this camp students will learn to draw the stylized faces, wardrobe and body types typical of Manga. We will also cover perspective, background design, special effect techniques and body language as well as the history of Manga and Anime.

Painting This camp is for students who love art. The focus of this camp will be the elements of painting. Campers at an introductory level or who are ready to be challenged will be guided through the use of pastels, water and oil-based paints. Subject matter will include: still life, landscape and the clothed figure. Students must provide their own supplies, please call for a materials list.



Photoshop Effects Create art using Apple© computers, digital cameras, and Adobe Photoshop©. We will let our imaginations run wild, morphing our photos into unique works of computer art. Students will learn to layer pictures, use filters, and manipulate color, size and backgrounds. Please bring a flash drive for storage.

Outdoor Painting Come experience the joy of outdoor painting. Students may paint in the medium of their choice, learning individually within the group setting. Students will meet at KAC 15 minutes prior to the start of camp for bus transportation to an off-site painting location, pick-up will also be at KAC. In the event of rain, students will paint indoors. Students should dress for the weather and bring water, a snack and/or lunch. Students must provide their own supplies, please call for a materials list. Note: There is a transportation fee of \$40 for this camp.

Pottery Students will learn the basics of hand-building and also work on the potter's wheel. Students can throw traditional pottery forms such as bowls, cups and vases and hand-build imaginative forms such as birdhouses, teapots or pitchers. Students with previous wheel experience are always welcome.

Sculpture In this class students will experiment with several sculpting mediums. We will spend two days sculpting the figure from a clothed model while learning proportion, anatomy, negative and positive space, scale and texture.

Silkscreen / Batik Learn various textile surface design techniques including block printing, bleach discharging and simple screen-printing. Students will use these techniques on printable garments or accessories and to create one-of-a-kind fabrics.

HIGH-SCHOOL SUMMER INTENSIVES

The Katonah Art Center Intensive is a great option for teens who love art and would like to focus intensively on a single topic. Each two-week (eight day) session is an exploration of a different art medium and/or subject. Our goal is to instill in each student the skills needed to continue to explore the subject independently. Groups are limited to 5 - 12 participants, depending on the topic. Specific materials are recommended in order for the student to fully indulge in his/her subject.

Two-Week (eight day) Intensives:

Week of June 25 & July 2*

Acrylics If acrylics were around when the impressionists were painting, it very well may have been their medium of choice! Acrylics are extremely versatile and can resemble watercolor, gouache or oil paints depending on the mediums used with them. In this intensive students will learn various acrylic painting techniques and have the opportunity to experiment with many different additive mediums and surfaces. A material list will be provided upon registration.

Week of July 9 & July 16

Large-Scale Drawing In this drawing Intensive students will learn to draw from the clothed and nude model. Students will work on large paper (minimum 24" x 36") in charcoal, starting with gesture drawings and progressing to longer more finished pieces. Students will learn about perspective, foreshortening and composition helping them to develop a sense of shape and proportion. The work done in this class will be a valuable addition to a portfolio! A material list will be provided upon registration.



Week of July 23 & July 30

Life Painting Students will work from the nude and clothed figure in oils or acrylics. Students will learn about composition, light, value, space as well as paint quality and technique. We will also look at the handling of the figure by many of "the great painters".

Week of August 6 & August 13



Oil Painting The painting medium of the old masters! In this class students will explore different oil painting styles such as impasto, glazing, dry brushing, layering and more. We will also experiment with various brushes, surfaces and palette knives. A material list will be provided upon registration.

Week of August 20 & August 27

Photojournalism Learn how to tell stories with photography using multiple photos in sequence. Students will advance beyond taking and printing single photos and will practice organizing and editing. Students will take field trips via bus to local parks to take pictures to be printed at the art center. There is a transportation fee of \$60 for this intensive.

Week of July 23 & July 30

Watercolors Nothing transcends the beautiful luminosity of watercolors. In this class we will learn about different watercolor techniques such as wet-in-wet, dry brush, masking with frisket etc. We will also explore the work of several watercolor painters. Students will have the opportunity to experiment with different types of paper and brushes.

Week of August 22 & August 29

Wheel Throwing In this class students will learn to throw traditional wheel forms. We will make bowls, cups and vases as we explore this age-old art form. A Clay and firing fee of \$.05 per cubic inch will be charged per piece.
