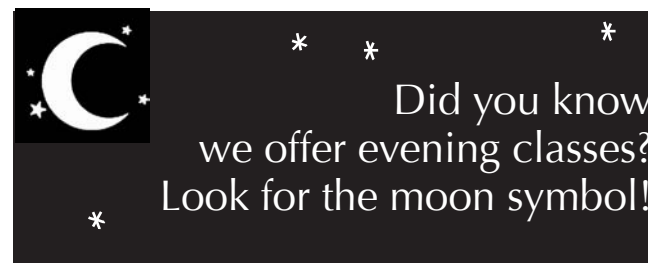

❄️ **Splash & Drag Watercolor** (teens/adults) Join artist Jock MacRae for the splash and drag watercolor blow out. This hands-on workshop will demonstrate innovative ways to explore new creative direction. Students will create a large work (22" x 30" or larger) on high quality watercolor paper. Students may work in watercolor, gouche or tempera paint. Students must provide their own materials, please call for a list.

WORKSHOPS

❄️ Classical Flowers (teens/adults) Join Mireille Duchesne, trained at the Beaux Arts in France, and learn to paint flowers using classical European methods. In this class we will work exclusively from flowers in oil paints or pastels. We will study Renaissance artists and learn about the techniques and formulas they employed to create their flower masterpieces. Students must provide their own materials, call for a materials list.

❄️ Monoprints (teens/adults) Spontaneous and expressive monoprints join the radiant qualities of prints with the spontaneity of painting. Monoprinting allows the artist considerable freedom in how they approach imagery. In this workshop we will explore working positively, by painting and drawing on the plate, or negatively, by covering a plate with paint or ink and removing with rags, swabs or fingers. Monoprints are always unique although you can obtain some repetition with repeated painting and printing. This workshop is perfect for anyone who is looking to loosen up their work or try something new!

❄️ Expressive Acrylics (teens/adults) If acrylic paint had been available during the Impressionist and Abstract Expressionist movements it just might have been the medium of choice! Once plastic-like and overly bright, acrylics have come a long way in color, flexibility and quality. In this class we will explore how this medium is perfect for loose, expressive painting. Because of its quick drying time acrylics make it easier to paint spontaneously and fearlessly since major changes can be quickly accomplished and undone if needed. Acrylics quick drying time also makes it possible to paint several layers of paint in one painting session. In this workshop students will also have access to various acrylic mediums and will learn how to use them. All levels are welcome - just bring your acrylics, some large paper or canvas (at least 30"x36") and an open mind!

Luminous Oil Paintings on Copper (teens/adults) This workshop teaches advantages, preparation, palette and technique involved in oil painting on copper. Learn why old masters such as Jan Breughel the Elder, Claude, El Greco and Rembrandt have all painted on copper and how using copper has helped preserve their works. Students will learn how to take advantage of the luminosity and vibrancy to their oil paintings. Liron will demonstrate surface preparation, and guided practice through a range of technique.

❄️ Pastels (teens/adults) In this workshop Loren Anderson will share her non-traditional methods of working with pastel. Emphasis will be on using pastels expressively as opposed to striving for realism. Students will learn to juxtapose colors in unexpected ways, and to incorporate texture and movement into solid forms as well as lines. Bring a photo, preferably one which evokes an emotional response for you, to use as starting point. Students must provide their own materials, call for a materials list.
